As a build up to this write, children have drawn the setting and explored the vocabulary from E B White’s description.</p>
		<p>Information Report Non-Fiction</p> <p>Purpose: To inform and forecast</p> <p>The purpose is to write a weather report explaining to the public all the strange weather events that have been happening over the last few days. They should also forecast what the weather will be like over the next few days. Children publish their reports using green screen and making a weather forecast with a map of the UK behind them.</p>		<p>Free Verse Poem Performance Poetry</p> <p>Purpose: To entertain and publish for display/perform</p> <p>The purpose is to create a poem about the Iron Man and the scrapyard. The first verse describes the Iron man himself, the second uses expanded noun phrases, onomatopoeia and alliteration to detail what is in the scrapyard. The third verse describes the iron man in the scrapyard.</p>		<p>Information Text Non-fiction (Non-Chronological Report)</p> <p>Purpose: To inform</p> <p>The purpose is to write an information booklet about the different types of spider and their features. The report will also include a scientific explanation of the life cycles of spiders.</p>
